#1 INTRODUCTION highlights the difference between paediatric cataract surgery and cataract surgery on adults and which infrastructure, facilities, equipment and trained manpower are required to perform cataract surgery on children. It also demonstrates one surgical procedure.	11 min
#2 STEP BY STEP (27 surgical video clips) shows and explains paediatric cataract surgery step-by-step on children of different age, using different approaches and techniques, and demonstrates how complications can be avoided. Also IOL power calculation and the differences of rigid vs foldable IOLs are discussed.	25 min
#3 SPECIAL SITUATIONS (20 surgical video clips) demonstrates and explains the management of special situations which a paediatric cataract surgeon may face, like plaques and membranes in anterior or posterior capsule, calcification in anterior cortex, pre-existing defects in posterior capsule, posterior lenticonus, microphthalmos, micro cornea and iris choroidal coloboma. It also shows secondary IOL implantation and management of traumatic cataracts.	28 min
#4 MANAGEMENT OF DIFFICULT SITUATIONS (17 surgical video clips) discusses the management of difficult situations and how to avoid and overcome complications, such as difficulties with the anterior and posterior capsule, with small pupils and IOL insertion, and the management of re-surgery.	35 min
#5 POST-OPERATIVE MANAGEMENT discusses post-operative management including intensive medication and daily examination, the importance of the right spectacles frame and glasses and which power should be prescribed. It also stresses the importance of amblyopia treatment and low vision services as well as regular follow-up visits. A final conclusion is given at the end.	5 min
